Employing a Sports Apprentice to work alongside current sports instructor.	To have the apprentices work during breakfast, lunch and after school clubs.	£8500	This gives the school an opportunity to run various sporting activities at lunchtime and break time. Enables more children to participate and offer a wide range of sporting activities at after school clubs.
Upskilling the permanent Sports Instructor	To make sure that the Sports Instructor attends relevant CPD events. Also during inset days teaching staff should be attending CPD events too.	£300	This is to make sure that the Sports Instructor is up to date with all PE teachings and learning new ways to incorporate changes in the curriculum. CPD for the teaching staff should improve whole school PE understanding.
Introduction new playtime and lunchtime clubs	Incorporate lunchtime clubs such as Netball and Football for KS2.	£300	With the introduction of new lunchtime clubs we hope to encourage more group orientated games and to boost the amount of physical activity at break times.
Renewing existing resources and equipment	To review the current equipment, making sure that anything faulty is replaced. While purchasing new equipment.	£500	Provides children with more opportunities to play with new equipment and take part in sports they might not originally think of playing.
Increasing the participation of children in sporting activities	To have a whole week dedicated to sporting activities offering children a wide variety of different sports. Some activities to be provided by outside companies to ensure the range of sports is extensive.	£400	This whole week dedicated to sport should encourage children to take part in activities they wouldn't usually participate in. The use of outside companies also gives the opportunity for children to make connections with clubs outside of school.
Providing children opportunities to compete in tournaments and fixtures in local schools	To make connections with local schools to arrange certain fixtures and to coach the pupils to the standard that is expected in competitions.	£150	To encourage healthy competition and fun learning. Also to enable elite children to be challenged while also making sure children who have not had the opportunity to represent the school can do so.
