Author Visits

Hannah Shaw visited Danson on Tuesday 8th March along with her cardboard cut-out of Unipiggle, hats and other props and even a magic trick! She wowed Reception and Key Stage One with her amazing illustrations of Unipiggle and the hungry badger from the book 'The Disgusting Sandwich'. All of the children listened to her read part of 'Unipiggle: Unicorn Muddle' and some children were chosen to act out scenes as the funny characters in the story. Finally, children took part in a draw-along where Hannah showed everyone how to give Unipiggle different expressions to show how he was feeling. 
