We started in full swing with our Book Week events.

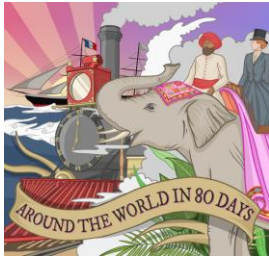


## Danson's Book Week Read Around the World!

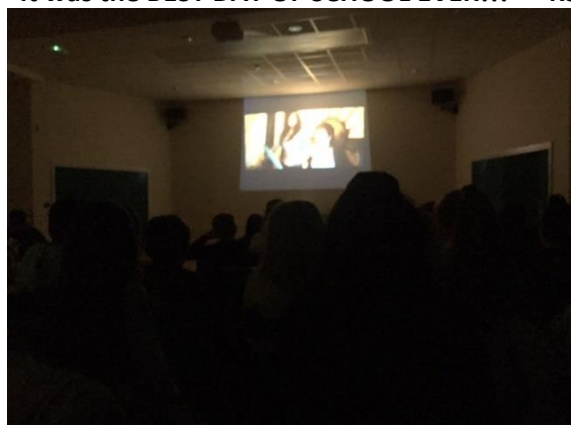
## Danson Primary's Film Nights

This year, Danson celebrated Safer Internet Day with the theme #FreeToBe... We thought about what being free online means to us. We discovered that some children like to play games online, some like to read books online and some like to research topics and learn new facts online! Every child in the school made a flag to be used as part of a bunting display in the computing suite.

The bunting celebrates our individual identities, freedom and uniqueness online! In lessons, we also discussed how to be safe online as people could use their freedom online to hurt other's feelings. We know that, if this happens to us, we must tell a trusted adult about any online issues, and that we can block and report unkind users online.

In Year 6, children looked at different scenarios of online behaviour, and the digital footprint it leaves behind. The children analysed how it could positively or negatively affect them later in life.

Year 5 created question cubes to ask each other six questions about how they are free and safe online. They responded to these questions in a video diary.

In Lower Key Stage Two, children read about different scenarios of online behaviour and decided whether the person was using their freedom sensibly or not.

In Year 2, children recognised different apps that they can use appropriately online and thought about how to be kind online.

Year 1 read a story about Digiduck and created online profiles for his famous farmyard friends and what they like to do online.

Early Years talked about what devices and games they can use and play with at school. Reception created penguin puppets after they read a story about Smartie the Penguin online.

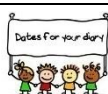
### Coronavirus

### Injury/Breakage

If your child has sustained a significant injury or bone breakage at home, they must be presented to the School Office with a parent/person designated by the parent to complete a Care Plan before they are reintegrated back into School. Failure to do this will result in your child not being able to attend School until this has been done.
