Working with the Local Community

Aiming High

On Tuesday 12th November, a group of children from Years 4 and 6 travelled to Bexleyheath Central Library. They had been selected to participate in a writing workshop with other local schools led by the well-known poet Noel Zetter. Throughout the day, the children enjoyed listening to Noel perform some of his entertaining poems, discovering more about the writing process and the inspiration for his poetry. The children were then tasked to plan, write and edit a poem based on the theme 'From where I stand...'. The focus and quality of writing produced by the children was fantastic and the end result was some truly impressive poems! It was a wonderful opportunity for the children to express their creativity and develop their poetry writing skills.









On Monday 18th November, a group of children from Years 5 and 6 took part in a mathematical workshop with other local schools led by the maths specialist Pete Hall. Throughout the day, children enjoyed learning and exploring lots of different mathematical questions that can be found on social media. The children were tasked to answer these and think about using BODMAS to help solve the questions. Also, they discussed why BODMAS was invented and why it is so important to use it to find the answers. In the afternoon the children explored the TANGRAM and looked at how it was invented. The children had a fantastic day and loved the opportunity of putting their mathematics skills into action.

Visitors to EYFS

This half term, Reception have been thinking about all the people who help us in our everyday life who they should view as Superheroes. The children were very excited to have the Firefighters from our local Eltham Fire Station. They were in their element squirting water from the hose, sitting in the Fire Engine, and finding out about the tools the Firefighters use and the jobs they have to do. The children then had a visit from a Midwife and weighed lifelike babies, used blood pressure machines, digital thermometers and listened to each other's heart beats with stethoscopes.



Our next visit was from the Police Force. We had lots of questions to ask them about their job and the equipment they use to do this. We were able to look inside the police van and even used the horn to set the siren off. It was so much fun! After our visits many of us now want to be Firefighters, Midwives and Police Officers when we grow up. We are also very grateful to our visitors for giving up their time to come and show us and talk to us about what they do every day for their occupations.



Parent Workshops

It was such a pleasure to host our Reception Maths workshop to our Reception parents on the 21st November. It was a great opportunity for our parents to have the opportunity to see what maths is like in action in our reception classes.
