On Tuesday 28<sup>th</sup> March, Nursery and Year 2 enjoyed a workshop led by volunteers from the banking group HSBC.

# Nursery: Treasure Hunt

This session provided an exciting first foray into the world of money when exploring coins and their value.

# Year 2: Toy Time

This workshop looked at the cost of buying toys and how long it would take to save up for a toy. During the session, Year 2 were able to recognise the choices they can make around spending and saving and how others may make different choices.

Throughout Summer Term 1, Years 4 and 5 will be taking part in a programme called 'Money Twist', led by a facilitator from a charity called My BNK. Year 4's first session looked at how and where money comes from, forms of payment and different bank accounts. In future sessions, they will cover making choices with money, understanding why people save, setting money goals and how setting positive money habits now will help in their future. For Year 5, session one raised their awareness of money habits, discussed the idea of delayed gratification (the act of resisting an impulse buy in the hope of saving for something more-valued in the future) and looked at strategies to resist temptation when spending. Future sessions this half term will explore choices made with money (considering the cost of living) as well as the benefits of saving, understanding interest and setting a future financial goal.

## Upcoming workshops

On Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> May and Friday 12<sup>th</sup> May, Reception and Year 1 will participate in a workshop led by volunteers from HSBC. In June and July, Years 3 and 6 will also take part in My BNK's Money Twist programme.

By the end of the academic year, all year groups across the school will have had the opportunity to develop their financial literacy in a workshop led by an external facilitator as well as through the embedding of financial education across the curriculum. This forms part of our continued commitment to developing children's confidence around money as learning about financial literacy from a young age will support our pupils to develop responsible money habits and attitudes for later in life.

# **Life Education Workshops**

The Coram Life Education & SCARF team visited Danson with their specially designed Life Space tent. Children in Years 1, 2 and 3 took part in some fun, interactive workshops which are designed to help them understand the importance of physical and emotional health and learn some vital life-skills.

**Year 1** took part in a workshop all about 'My Wonderful Body'. They learnt about the major food groups and looked at an interactive body model to learn how food, water and oxygen get into the body to give it energy. They also looked at the Healthy Wheel and considered the different things we need to be happy and healthy.

**Year 2's** workshop explored the theme of 'Feelings'. They began by considering what their bodies need to stay physically and emotionally healthy using SCARF's Healthy and Wellbeing Wheel. Following this, they discussed the safe use of medicines and learnt about the body using an interactive body model. To end, they became 'Feelings Detectives' and looked at the importance of friendships.

**In Year 3**, the children took part in a workshop called 'Meet the Brain'. They explored the Wellbeing Wheel and referred to its five ways to emotional good health throughout the workshop. They considered how to ensure online behaviour was both healthy and balanced. Then, using interactive techniques, the children considered the importance of each body organ before meeting the classroom brain. They learnt how a brain sends and receives signals through nerves and how it controls movements.

Finally, Year 3 explored whether choices about taking a medicine, exercise, sleep, drinking alcohol and smoking cigarettes help or harm the body.

The children, in all year groups, thoroughly enjoyed the workshops and came away with lots of information about how their body works and how to stay physically and emotionally healthy. The best bit was when we got to meet Harold the Giraffe at the end!
