Cyberbullying Assembly

I Can Writing Day

Reception Farm Visit

What an amazing visit the Reception children had from Rocky's Animals. They had the chance to hold a variety of different animals such as a tree frog, pygmy hedgehog and a tortoise. The children got to learn about what the animals need to survive and how they adapt to different environments. The goats were so nosey and hungry! The children all had the chance to feed them some carrots. This visit really helped the children expand on their prior knowledge from their topic on animals last half term.



Year 4 Trip to Lesnes Abbey

On Wednesday and Thursday, Year 4 had the fantastic opportunity to visit the wonderful Lesnes Abbey. During our time there, we explored the fascinating world of the Vikings, learning about how they lived and what they ate. We discovered the old Norse language and the significance of runes, which were used to form the Viking language. It was intriguing to find out that some cities we know today have names that date back to the Viking era, and we learned how the suffix of a name can indicate whether a city had been fortified or was primarily farmland.

One of the highlights of our visit was discovering how the Vikings made fire and baked bread, experiencing first-hand how different their methods were from our own modern-day baking techniques. In the other half of the day, we enjoyed re-enacting the various battles between the Anglo-Saxons and the Vikings, learning how they eventually negotiated a treaty that allowed them to rule different parts of England together.

Overall, our adventure at Lesnes Abbey was a truly amazing day filled with fun under the sun. We absorbed a wealth of knowledge about the Vikings, their culture, and their impact on our history.
