Anti-Bullying Week 15 – 19 November 2021

During the week 15 – 19 November, Danson will be celebrating Anti-Bullying Week. This year the theme is 'One Kind Word'. In a world that can sometimes feel like it's filled with negativity, one kind word can provide a moment of hope. It can be a turning point. It can change someone's perspective. It can change their day. It can change the course of a conversation and break the cycle of bullying. Best of all, one kind word leads to another. Kindness fuels kindness. So, from the playground to Parliament, and from our phones to our homes, together, our actions can fire a chain reaction that powers positivity.

Over the course of the week, children will be taught to celebrate and respect each other's differences, to develop a greater understanding of what bullying is, how making small changes can make a safer place for everyone and how to stay safe online. At Danson, we endeavour to teach our children to be kind to one another as well as being empathic to each other's feelings.

To start Anti-Bullying/Kindness Week, the children are invited to wear odd socks with their uniform on Monday 15th November to celebrate what makes us unique. There will be no contribution needed for this.





Information for Parents and Carers

- The Anti-Bullying Alliance defines bullying as the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face-to-face or online.
- At Danson, we work with the children to understand and know that bullying is unkind but being unkind doesn't necessarily mean bullying. We work with the children to know how to spot the difference and what to do if this happens to them.
- At Danson, we aim to tackle bullying by trying to prevent it from happening in the first place and by tackling it consistently, fairly and effectively when it does. We are here to educate all our pupils about the importance of kindness. We are here to educate our pupils about consequence, impact and how their actions whether intentional or not can hurt others.
- Over the course of Anti-Bullying/Kindness Week, the children will take part in different activities and circle time discussions about friendship, bullying and who to turn to for help if he/she feel they

are being bullied or have experienced someone being unkind to them. We will share **what has** occurred and how it has been and could be resolved by both parties in moving forward.
