Year 1 have had a super busy term!

As part of our Kings, Queens and Castle topic in history, we took a road trip down the motorway to Leeds Castle. Whilst there, we dressed up in costumes of all the people who had lived in the castle since it was first built. We then had a tour of the inside of the castle and found the 'secret stairway'. We were given VIP access to parts of the castle that not many other visitors get to see! It really helped us to understand how people become Kings and Queens, and also deepened our understanding of the parts of the castle by seeing them in real life, these being the moat, drawbridge and battlements!

We were so inspired by our time at Leeds Castle, Mrs Foskett taught us the art skills of colour mixing, colour creation and collage to create Leeds Castle pieces of artwork!

Also this term, we thoroughly enjoyed sports day. It was great to have so many people cheering us on whilst we demonstrated our skills of throwing, running, tactics, teamwork and collaboration. It was a hot, sticky and fun afternoon for us all!

Sports Week was great fun for us all. We loved cheerleading. We learned about 'stunting' and practised our cheerleading poses with partners. We found out what the terms 'low V' and high V' meant and played games using them. It has been an excellent Summer term in Year 2.

In maths we have looked at shapes and their properties as well as using them in patterns. We also learned about numbers to 1,000 and measurement for capacity and volume using millilitres and litres. Finally, we have explored calculation strategies using column method addition and subtraction.

In English we read a book called 'Sticky McStickstick' who is a walking stick belonging to Michael Rosen. We wrote a letter in the first person from the point of view of Sticky McStickstick using emotive language. We also read the beautiful poetry book called 'What do you see when you look at a tree? In response to the text, we wrote some descriptive poems exploring the many things a tree can be.

Throughout this term the children have explored different nurses and how they have impacted current healthcare. In history, Florence Nightingale was the first nurse we learnt about and we compared what she did and achieved with Edith Cavell. We also looked at and remembered Mary Seacole and what she accomplished. We compared all of them and how they embodied the Danson Values.

We had a brilliant Sports Week and had the opportunity to experience and learn many new skills including cricket, cheerleading, dance, fencing, dodgeball and cricket. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed a very hot Sports Day, demonstrating great teamwork and resilience in completing the different activities.

In geography, we developed our map skills and explored how Danson Park and the surrounding area has changed over time. We also visited Danson Park and followed a map, answering questions about the park on our walk.



It has been an extremely busy and exciting term in Year 3. Here are some of the highlights...

The children had a fantastic time during sports week. They have been working hard all term to hone their athletic skills which they showed off to you all on their sports day. The staff were all extremely proud of each and every children who showed the Danson values of friendship, respect, collaboration and resilience in abundance.

Later in the term we had a fantastic day at the British museum, we saw some incredible relics from the past and really enjoyed consolidating all of our learning about the Romans and their impact on Britain. We were so impressed with the behaviour of all of the children on the trip and we even had members of the public praising them for their politeness.

We were also extremely lucky to be invited to St John's church to learn all about what happens in the church. We really enjoyed learning about the different colours that the vicars wear throughout the year and we even got to see what happens during a baptism. This trip really brought our RE learning about Christianity to life.



What an amazing summer term year 4 have had to end the year!

In the first week back, we went to Horton Kirby Nature Reserve as a link to our science topic. We had a fantastic time bird watching and pond dipping where we learnt amazing facts about some of the animals that we found. We also spent time searching the long grass and wading in the river find insects. We used classification keys to help us identify the various creatures.

Throughout the year, the children have been working hard on developing their times table fluency. We have practised this with games and quizzes, and the children have made great progress in preparation for the times table check. They have shown great commitment and determination which has clearly paid off! Well done to everyone!

In English, we have been reading a book called 'How to Bee' linking to our Geography topic. We have immersed ourselves in the book by writing from the main character's point of view when writing a letter. We finished the unit by writing a set of instructions to make a bee hotel, which we ended up making as part of Geography lessons. We have placed these bee hotels around the school environment to encourage and support bees in these areas.

We continued to engage with topic by inviting the beekeepers from Ruxley Beekeepers association to the school. They came equipped with beekeeper suits, honey and a range of products made from beeswax and honey. We were fortunate enough for them to also bring along an observation hive, where we could watch the bees working in action. This was a fascinating experience and the knowledgeable visitors shared so many amazing bee facts with us!

We also had a fantastic time during sport week where we were able to taking part in various sports and learn a range of new skills. Some examples of the sports we tried were: cheerleading, American football and cricket. During the week we took part in sports day where we saw great examples of the Danson Values including collaboration and resilience.

It has been a fantastic end to this academic year and we hope the children all have a great summer.



Year 5 have worked incredibly hard this term in preparation for their transition to Year 6. Our science learning particularly captivated the attention of everyone, as we watched caterpillars turn into beautiful butterflies in our classrooms. In geography, we have been learning all about the physical and human features of North America. We have studied the countries within the continent but we have focused lots on the United States of America. We compared the Rocky Mountains to Ben Nevis (one of our school houses) and compared the River Thames to the Colorado River.

Our latest English learning has been focused on writing an alternative fairytale, 'Snow White In Hawaii' which relates to our understanding of North America. We connected this learning to our computing work too where we have been learning about augmented reality. We created QR codes to take the viewer to a voice recording of a book review. In DT, we also used our story writing as an inspiration to create a pop-up book for younger readers.

Sports Week was a huge success for Year 5 and we got to take part in track and field events on Sports Day, glow in the dark dodgeball, fencing, cricket and how to make a healthy smoothie with the 'smoothie bike'. It was a very warm week and we were so proud of how the children got stuck into their different activities. We also wanted to thank parents and carers who were able to attend Sports Day.

We needed to apply our maths skills on Sports Day in one of the tasks where each team had to collect the most amount of water in a bucket. In maths, in the summer term, we have learnt about converting units of measurement, volume and continued with our decimal knowledge.

As well as the watersports trip, Year 6 also had two other trips this term. First, we went to Chislehurst Caves to consolidate our learning about World War II. More recently, we visited Horton Kirby to complete some geography fieldwork. The children completed a river study and enjoyed getting into the river to collect data and establish the speed at which the river moved at different points. In the education centre, we learnt about why this is and consolidated our learning about the parts of a river.

Of course the highlight of this term has been performing our production of Revolting Children based on the novel Matilda by Roald Dahl. All of the children (and adults!) worked incredibly hard to put this together and the finished product was nothing short of amazing.
